Carol-Anne Moulton graduated from The University of Melbourne, Melbourne Australia in 1992 and completed general surgical training earning certification from the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons in 2001. She undertook several Fellowships following this including a Fellowship in Upper Gastrointestinal and Laparoscopic Surgery at St. Vincents Hospital in Melbourne, a Fellowship in Hepato-Pancreatico-Biliary (HPB) Surgery at Toronto General Hospital, and a Surgical Education Fellowship at the University of Toronto, earning a Master's of Higher Education in 2006 and a PhD in 2010. She is an Associate Professor in the Department of Surgery and the Director of the HPB Fellowship Program at the University of Toronto. In early 2010, Dr. Moulton became a Scientist at the Wilson Centre at the University of Toronto, and she is the recipient of the Early Researcher Award from the Ministry of Research and Innovation. Her research has been supported by the Medical Council of Canada, the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, and Physicians' Services Incorporated.
